

MONTRÉAL-TRUDEAU: SITUATION CONCERNING FLIGHTS TO EUROPE

Montréal, April 19, 2010 – Aéroports de Montréal (ADM) wishes to inform the travelling public flying out of Montréal–Trudeau airport that despite the gradual reopening of airspace affected by the volcanic ash cloud, some flights departing for European airports remain cancelled.

In addition, because of the backlog of cancelled flights, the situation is not expected to return to normal for several days.

In light of these conditions, it is imperative that passengers awaiting a departure for Europe contact their airline to check the exact status of their flight and avoid showing up at the airport unless they have received prior firm confirmation of their reservation.

ADM wishes to thank the passengers for their cooperation.

Aéroports de Montréal is the local airport authority responsible for the management, operation and development of Montréal–Trudeau and Montréal–Mirabel international airports under the terms of a lease entered into with Transport Canada in 1992. The Corporation employs a total of some 625 persons at both airports and at head office.
